Places Providing Assistance for Particular Needs in Marshall County

Angel Tree Program – many area churches get names from various sources (schools, welfare dept, Good Samaritan) and provide specific gifts for children at Christmas. Contact Sonya Cox 359-4947.

Care Kitchen – McKnight Center on 4^{th} Ave. – 6:00 p.m. on first and third Thursday nights – free hot meal and devotional; sponsored by area churches.

Centerstone Mental Health – provides services on a sliding scale based on income; call for appointment; Located at 1601 Nashville Highway; 359-5802.

Elks Lodge – assists with toys/gifts for children at Christmas; members are often called on to assist individuals. Located at 280 Woodside Avenue.

Good Samaritan – located downtown at 131 East Commerce Street (old Easy Pay Bldg) – open Tuesday and by appointment – Phone numbers are posted – provide household furnishings, food, some monetary assistance with utilities – Wallace Haley, director; Phone 359-4806.

Hunters for the Hungry - annual give-away of processed deer meat; Mike Adams is the contact.

Lewisburg Lions Club – pays for eyeglasses for those who cannot afford them. Terry Jackson is the program contact; Farm Bureau 326 West Commerce.

Marshall County Health Department – assists with baby needs and health; baby milk through Wick programs; birth control assistance; vaccinations; assistance with stop smoking; 206 Legion Avenue; Angie Faulkner, director. 359-1551.

Marshall County Library – "the new concept in libraries" – public access computers are free to use; bulletin board often has job and housing postings; assistance with taxes by appointment; warm place during day and early evening to get out of the weather. Located at 310 Old Farmington Road.

Marshall County Transportation — available for any age. Must phone 24 hours ahead, before noon, to schedule a trip. Local residents pay \$1 each way for a ride in town. Eat at the Hardison School Annex Nutrition Site weekdays for \$1.50. Cafeteria style hot meal. Delivery available for shut-ins at same rate. Must be set up with paperwork.
